GALLUP POLL SOCIAL SERIES: MINORITY RIGHTS & RELATIONS UPDATE

-- FINAL TOPLINE --

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Results are based on telephone interviews conducted August 9-22, 2013 with –1,001-- non-Hispanic blacks, aged 18+, living in all 50 U.S. states and the District of Columbia. All respondents had previously been interviewed in the Gallup Daily tracking survey.

For results based on this sample of blacks, one can say with 95% confidence that the margin of error is ± 4 percentage points.

Interviews are conducted with respondents on landline telephones and cellular phones.

Respondents were weighted in the initial sample to correct for unequal selection probability, non-response, and double coverage of landline and cell users in the two sampling frames. They are also weighted to match the national demographics of gender, age, race, Hispanic ethnicity, education, region, population density, and phone status (cell phone-only/landline only/both and cell phone mostly). Demographic weighting targets are based on the March 2012 Current Population Survey figures for the aged 18 and older U.S. population. Phone status targets are based on the July-December 2011 National Health Interview Survey. Population density targets are based on the 2010 census. All reported margins of sampling error include the computed design effects for weighting.

The obtained re-contact sample of blacks is then weighted to match national demographics for blacks 18+ on age, gender, education and census region.

In addition to sampling error, question wording and practical difficulties in conducting surveys can introduce error or bias into the findings of public opinion polls.
